**Glasgow Philharmonic Male Voice Choir** have now completed 83 years of singing in Glasgow, having evolved from the Partick Male Voice Choir. They are the only Scottish Male Voice Choir to have performed in the biennial Festival of Male Voice in the Albert Hall, London, organised by the London Welsh Male Voice Choir. In 2006 they were the guest choir at the Lanarkshire Festival of Male Voice, and performed for the first time as full members in Hamilton Town House in April 2007. The Lord Provost of the City of Glasgow has become our patron. Under musical director William Barr, the singing quality of the choir has continued to progress. There are vacancies in all sections (first and second tenor, baritone and bass). They rehearse every Tuesday evening from September onwards in Adelaides, 209 Bath Street, Glasgow, starting at 7pm.
